ABOUT THE ARTISTS

A creative innovator linked to the great romantic tradition of the past, guitarist **ELIOT FISK** is one of the most exciting and unique artists before the public today. Known world wide for his adventurous repertoire and willingness to take art music into unusual venues, he belongs, as his great mentor Andrés Segovia once wrote, “at the top line of our artistic world.” A massive new double CD featuring contemporary works written for and transcribed by Eliot Fisk will be released in early 2010 by Wildner Records.

BCGS Director **DANIEL ACSADI** is a compelling performer, creative educator and expert arranger, focusing on art and folk music from the US and Europe, including his native Hungary.

ZAIRA MENESES is among the most exciting performers on the international classical guitar concert circuit. Her musicality and charisma have delighted audiences on 3 continents in a wide variety of programs.

JEROME MOUFFE has dazzled international audiences with his passionate and spontaneous playing, having toured in Europe and the US. He just released his debut CD, Capriccio, on the VGo Recordings label.

An acclaimed violist, pianist, and vocalist, Fulbright scholar **LETICIA PRIETO ALVAREZ** has performed extensively in her native Spain and the US. She is currently immersed in the field of music therapy.

Contemporary guitar virtuoso **MAARTEN STRAGIER** recently performed with acclaimed NEC avant-garde group [nec]shivaree and at Guitar & Friends in Newton, MA. He is a doctoral candidate at New England Conservatory.
